PLAN FOR OPERATION OF THE DISTRICT AND
REQUEST FOR FINAL AND COMPLETE ORGANIZATION
OF DISTRICT

Now come the Board of Trustees of the Ayersville Water and
and Sewer District, heretofore established by order of this Court and
the Board of Trustees of Highland Township for the purpose of
requesting the final and complete organization of said District and
filing herein the plan for the operation of the District as follows:

1. The territory included in the District shall be the
lands described in the original petition after elimination of
the lands described in the certificate filed in this Court on
December 13, 1967, and in adding thereto the First, Second, Third
and Fourth Additions to Slusser's Home Addition and the north
thirty (30) acres of the Northwest quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Five (5)
in Highland Township.

2. The governing Board of Trustees of the District shall
consist of seven (7) members whose term shall be four years on
a rotating or staggered basis and who shall serve without
compensation until such time as the District shall have an
operating water system at which time the terms of compensation
shall be fixed, and who shall be appointed by the Board of
Trustees of Highland Township. The operation of the District
will be financed by levy of taxes and assessments and by the
sale of water and collection of fees for various services
rendered to water and sewer users.

3. The Ayersville Water and Sewer District proposes to
construct a system of water mains and laterals to distribute
treated water purchased in bulk from the City of Defiance. The
project includes the construction of a 150,000 gallon elevated
water storage tank to maintain the distribution pressure and
to provide a reserve equal to two (2) days demand. A pump
station will be constructed at the point of connection to

the City of Defiance water main to provide adequate pressure in the distribution system.

4. The contractor for the construction will be selected by the competitive bidding procedure.

WHEREFORE, your petitioners pray that the Court declare the District finally and completely organized and to be empowered to continue as a political subdivision for such other orders as may be in conformity with the law.


